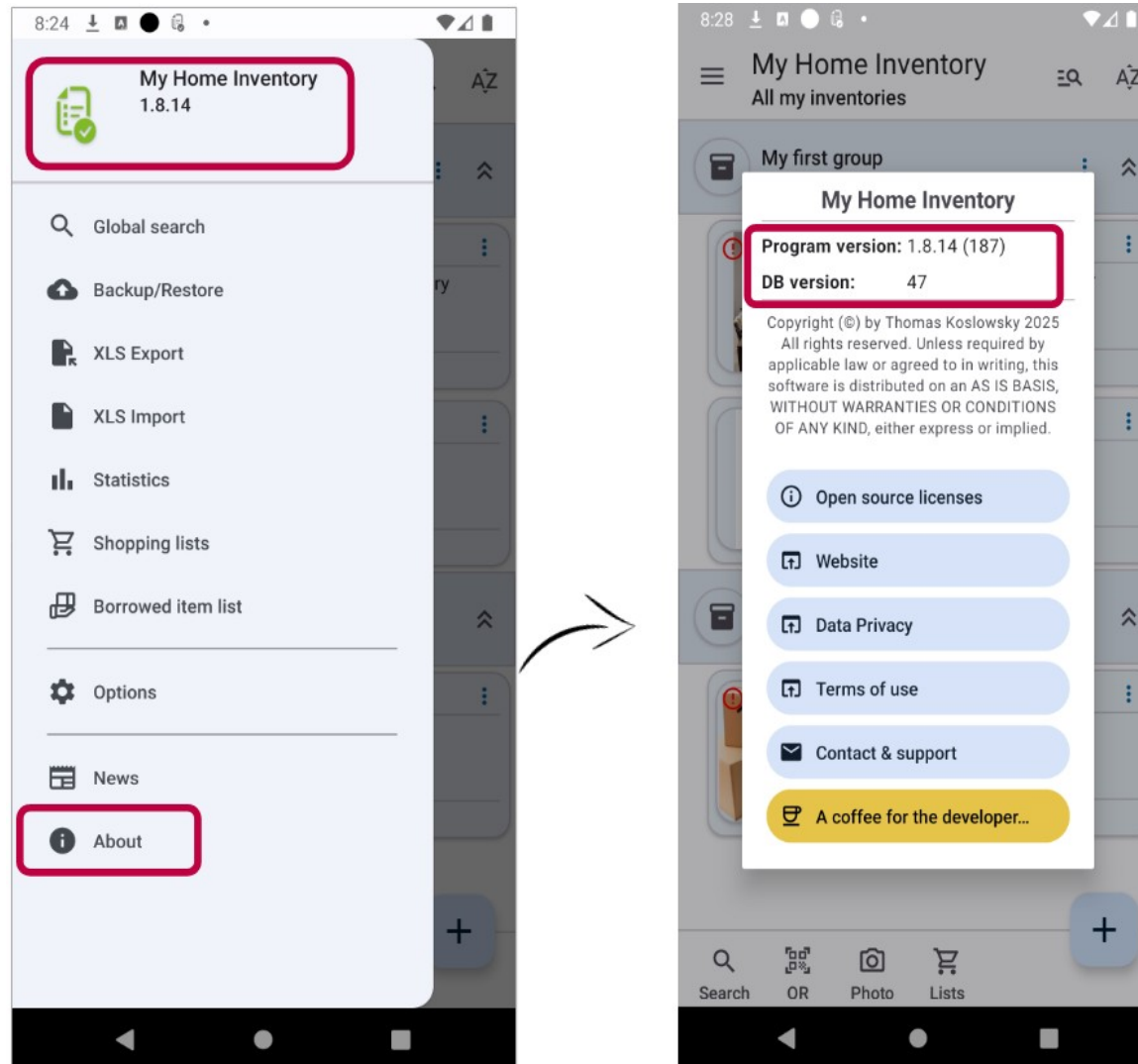

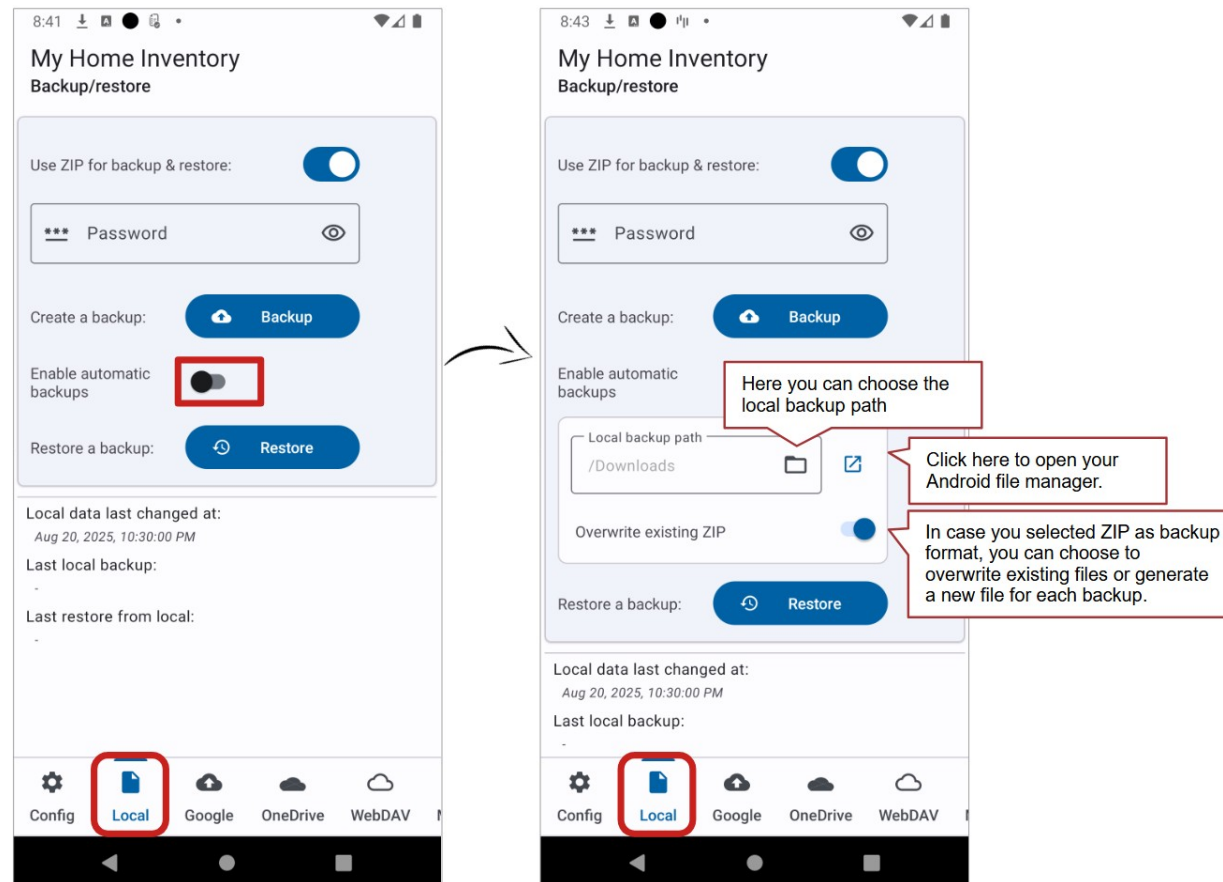

2.1 Automatable local backups

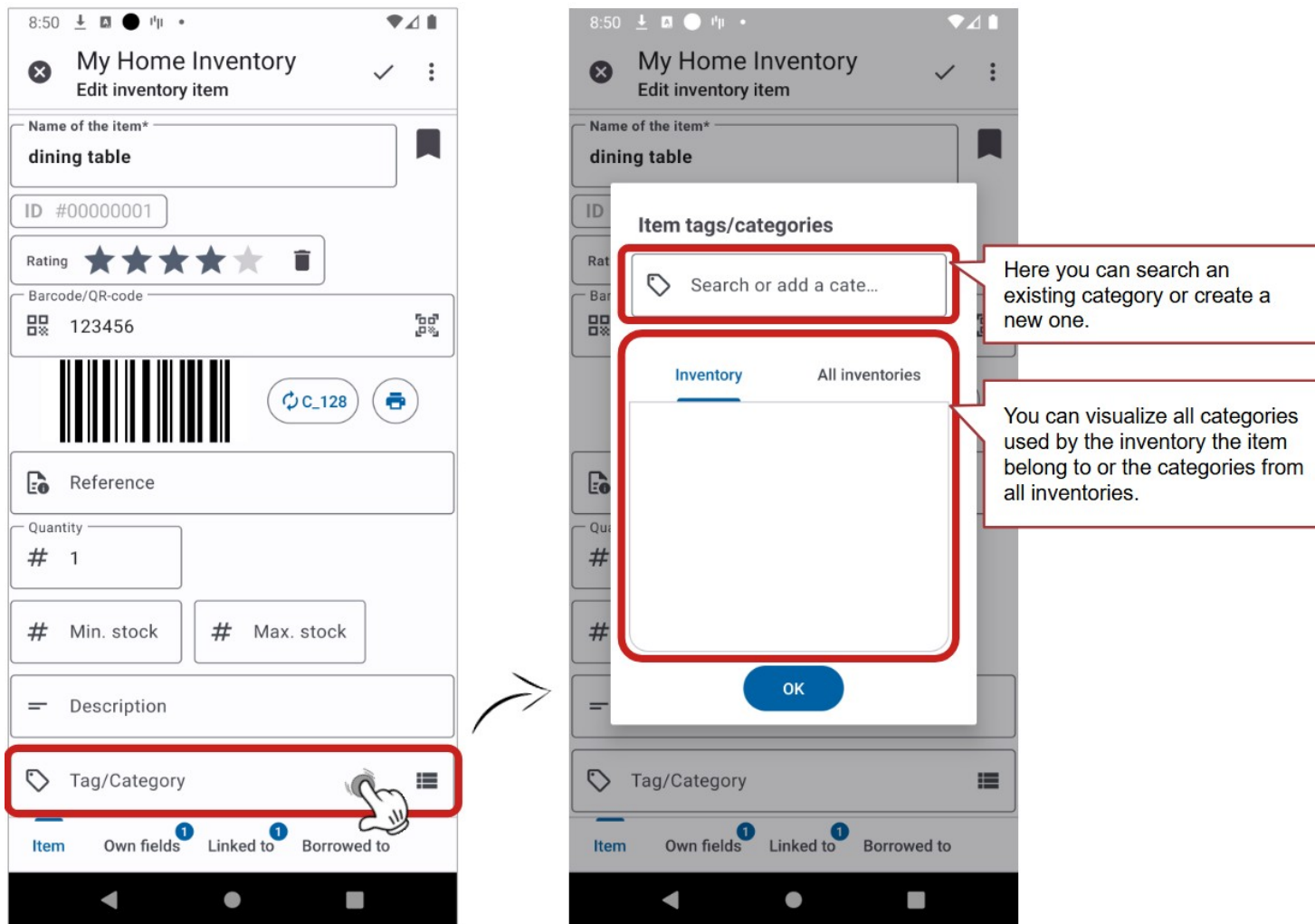
You can automate local backups by enabling the option on the *Local Backup* page. After activation, you must select a folder where the app will store the backups. If the **ZIP option** is enabled, the backup will be saved as a ZIP file named **MyInvBackup.zip**. Each new backup will overwrite the previous one, while the older file is renamed to **MyInvBackup.zip.old**. If you prefer to keep all backups, disable the **Overwrite existing ZIP** option. In that case, each backup will be stored in a separate file named **MyInvBackup_YYYYMMDD_HHMMI.zip**, where YYYY is the year, MM the month, DD the day, HH the hour, and MI the minutes of creation. If you choose not to use ZIP backups, you must select a folder where the app will copy all current data and files. During each backup, new files will be added and modified files updated in that folder. Please note: the app cannot write directly to Android system folders such as **Documents**. If you select a system folder, the app will automatically create a sub folder named **MyInvBackup** inside it.

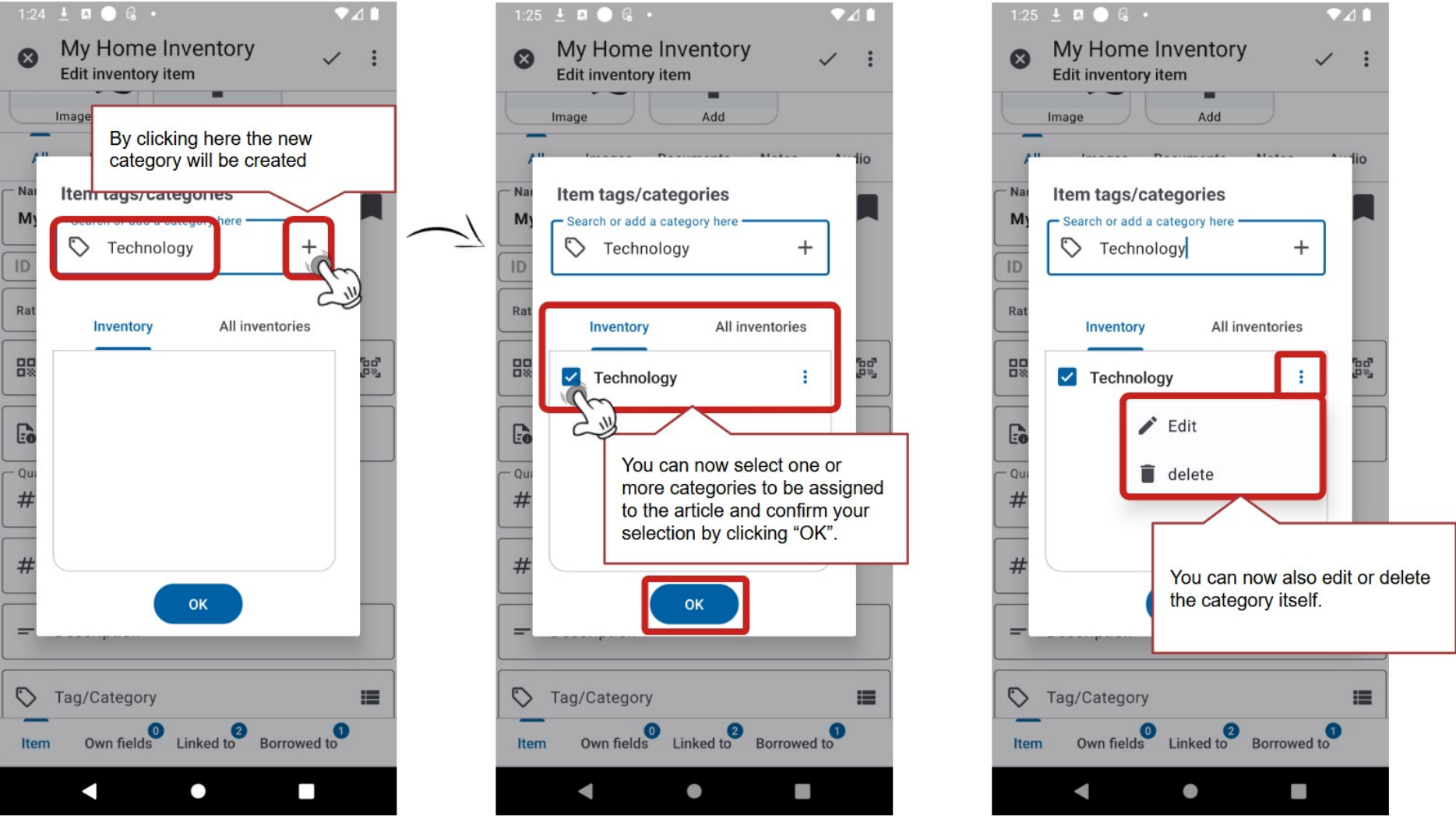
Finally, a backup will only be created if changes have been made in your app data since the last backup.



2.2 Multiple categories per article

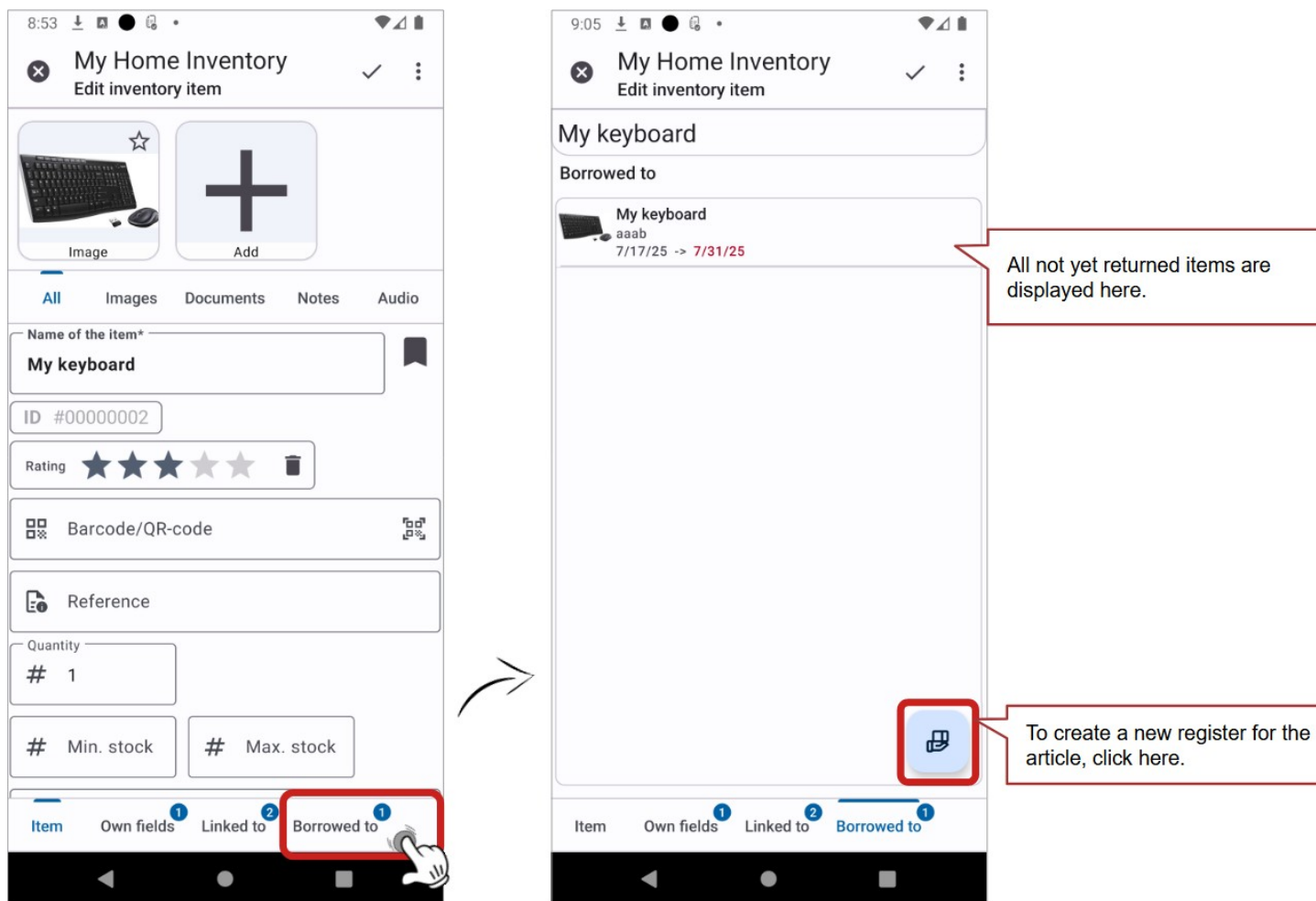
You can assign multiple categories to articles. To do so just click in the category field in the article edit view, to open the category selector.



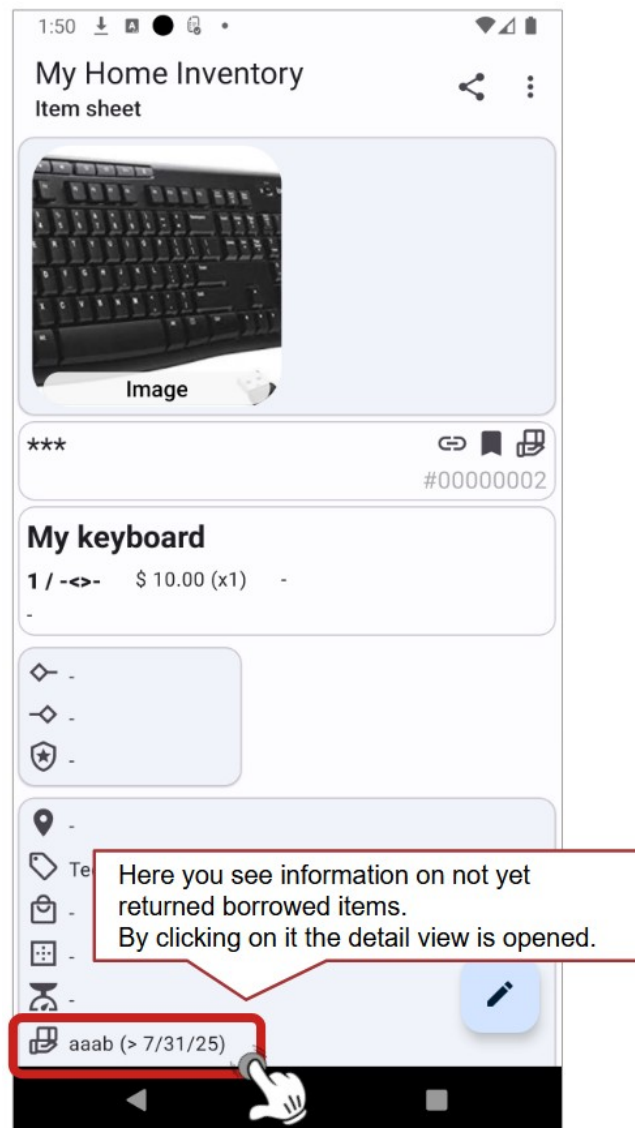


2.3 "Borrowed to" page in the article edit view

In the article edit view you find a "Borrowed to" tab which shows information in case the article has been borrowed and not yet returned.



For borrowed and not yet returned items you find also information on the item sheet. You can click on it to open the detail view.



2.4 Element selection in the filter dialog

In the filter dialog, you can open a selection window by long-clicking on the highlighted filter buttons to use an existing element from your data as a filter.

2.5 Other improvements and corrections (bug-fixes)

This version includes the following improvements/fixes:

N.° of issue	Description of the improvement/fixed issue
#578	Barcode reader – show the barcode format separated from the code.
#573, #574	Article page – Show info about the shopping list in which the item is included. Show currently pending returns in case the item is currently borrowed.
#572	Article search – search results should always be sorted.
#557	The backup notification is sometimes not displayed when the app is initially launched.
#561	Image edit view – the zoom is always applied on the upper left corner.
#564	Article page – link 2 and 3 are not opening after click.
#563	Edit Article – rating should have a reset/delete option.
